On Wednesday, November 4th, St. James' held a virtual **Celtic Vespers**, a non-denominational candlelight service featuring prayers and music of Ireland, Scotland, England, and Wales. Christianity flourished throughout the British Isles for many centuries emphasizing a sense of God and the saints as a continuing, personal and helpful presence. Women often held positions of authority. Love of nature, the wild and elemental were reminders of God's gifts. Vespers or evening prayer is deemed "Celtic" by the spirit of the liturgy rather than any formal form. The Celtic Vespers service, steeped in tradition, invites the congregation to enter into a place of prayer, reflection and peace and offers participants an opportunity to light a candle in remembrance. Our service began with *Tar a Thighearna* (Come, Lord, come thou Being) and continued with readings, General Thanksgiving, and communal prayers of intercession and healing. Interspersed throughout the service were hymns plus Celtic music performed by Wild Notes (Kasha Breau - harp, John Kalinowski – concertina and Mickey Koth – flute). We anticipate offering Celtic Vespers services again in the new year.

Our tradition of Advent Lessons and Carols continues on Sunday, November 29, at 9:00 a.m. This virtual service on Advent I will include readings and music in anticipation of the coming of Christ. Pre-recorded music will be provided by the St. James' choirs and guest choirs, including selections from our 2018 service. Please join us that morning as we begin Advent and the new church year.

Lunch in the Park, Hartford



Church by the Pond,

aka, "Lunch in the Park" here at St. James' is an "ecclesia ministry" (in that it is a church without walls) of Christ Church Cathedral. Every Saturday throughout the year, regardless of the weather, a service is held at 2 p.m. in an open space near the carousel in Bushnell Park in Hartford. The service is open to all and often includes people who aren't comfortable worshipping in a traditional church service. From 20-60 people, many of them homeless and living in shelters, gather for the service. They come to hear God's word and most seem to feel the comfort of liturgies learned as children. The celebrants at the service are Episcopal and Lutheran clergy from the greater Hartford area who preach and share the good news of Jesus Christ's love. Immediately following the service, bag lunches prepared by a church or community group are distributed to the participants.

On October 24, St. James' prepared over 100 sandwiches and created over 50 bag lunches containing two sandwiches, chips, cookies, and water. In 2021 we will be participating in this ministry on two dates, May 1st and September 25th. Please consider joining us next year in this rewarding ministry!

ECCT Annual Convention 2020

This year's Annual Convention was held from October 14 through October 18. Because of the pandemic, all proceedings were held online via Zoom. The Reverend Denise, Becky Lee, and Caryl Donovan represented St. James'.

At sessions held on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, the convention considered one "Big Question" each day. Delegates met in breakout groups to discuss the topic after which the entire convention re-gathered to summarize our conversations. As a result, groups have been formed to initiate action on of each of the given daily topics.

Wednesday's "Big Question" focused on what ECCT and its members can do to address the issue of wealth inequality. Thursday's "Big Question" asked, which of the pandemic changes we have already made and will KEEP to encourage a continuing culture of discovery in parishes. The topic of Friday's "Big Question" was, how parishes can educate themselves about the reality of systemic racism, white supremacy and anti-Black bias, and how parishes will be compelled to take action as followers of Jesus.



Musical Musings - Jim Barry

In the past few months, I have learned a lot about Zoom, PowerPoint, and audio editing. Preparing music for virtual services has been a challenge and a joy. I am grateful to the O'Donnells who have been our recording singers these past few months while we observe restrictions on group singing.

Moving forward, our choir joined with three other Glastonbury choirs to collaborate on a hymn for Thanksgiving week. Each person, while listening to a master track, recorded their own voice and submitted that recording to be combined into a full, finished product. United in song, the choirs had the opportunity to offer their musical gifts despite not being able to gather in-person. The process will be used in the coming months by our own choir as we continue to present pre-recorded music during our virtual services.

During this down time for the choir, the music library underwent a thorough review. Thanks to Valerie Huestis who spent hours checking each file and comparing it with our Excel catalogue spreadsheet. Nearly 1200 items were reviewed, so that when the choir returns, our choir library will be updated and ready.
