Rector's Ramblings

For those of you who were either in church or watched us on YouTube Live on Sunday, January 23rd, this Rector's Rambling will sound familiar, as it is taken from my State of the Parish address that day. I just think it is worth repeating (not because it is so good, but because it is so important). So, 2022 gives us a budget that presents us with a different future, one that is perhaps a little scary because it is unfamiliar, different. Even so, there is no reason to doubt that God will bless this community in the same gracious and abundant way that God has in the past.

Yes, Covid is still with us, and numbers are high, although getting better every day. People who are vaccinated and boosted are not getting very sick – they are recovering quickly and are staying alive.

We are gathering together once again in our beloved church. We might have a budget that is changing the way things have always been, but it does not mean that change cannot bring about wonderful and amazing things that we can't even envision yet because with God, all things are possible. This same community that just came through 2020 and 2021, not only still standing but growing (yes, we have new faces in our pews), can thrive with God's help in 2022.

In Luke's Gospel we have a wonderful story of Jesus, having been baptized by John and having heard the words of God saying, "You are my Son, with you I am well pleased" then goes out into the wilderness, a dark and scary time and place to figure out who he is, what his ministry is going to be all about. Then emboldened by the Holy Spirit (remember that fire we spoke of a several weeks ago, that passion that burns in us all, Jesus, is full of that) and he walks into his local synagogue, steps up to be the lay reader, opens to Isaiah, and proclaims his mission to a room full of people who know him, and he knows are probably not going to welcome him with open arms. And no sooner had he sat down and began to teach them when they were running him out of town. But he knew what he had to do, he knew what God was asking of him and he was ready to face whatever came.

Filled with the Spirit, listening to where God is leading you and courageously following, you can do anything. And that means all of you. There will be a place, a role, a ministry, a mission for all of you if you choose to accept it. Paul reminds us that the body of Christ, us, is made of parts, none too small or unimportant to be a part of making it all work. You have all you need to thrive as a faith community, living, loving, giving, building the beloved community of God right here in Glastonbury.

But you have to make the choice, you have to decide to be all in with making this happen. Because as St. Augustine tells us, "God without us will not, and we without God, cannot." God has shown us God is with us, ready to lead you into all good things. You have to decide - are you with God? And if you are, this will be an amazing place in 2022 and beyond.

Afghan Refugees Resettlement Update

River East Resettlement Alliance (RERA) is an official co-sponsorship group! In January, an interfaith group of individuals from multiple towns, including several St. James' parishioners, were approved by Integrated Refugee & Immigrant Services (IRIS) to serve as a co-sponsorship group who is allowed to resettle a refugee or immigrant family in the area. A lot of work went in to getting our application completed, submitted and approved but we are pleased to now be moving forward toward becoming "green-lighted", which means we will be ready to accept a family within 48 hours. We expect to let IRIS know we are ready on or around March 1st. Once we have notified IRIS, and they give us the "green light", our Afghan family could arrive in CT as soon as two days later! Currently we do not know anything about the family that will be assigned to RERA, but we are planning the best we can.

RERA is led by two co-leaders, and comprised of 14 committees made up of about 50 volunteers. All committees are full, although more childcare volunteers (babysitters) are needed and welcome! We have rented a 3-bedroom apartment in Manchester, where the family will be housed. It is very conveniently located, and is fairly spacious. The Apartment Set-up committee has done an amazing job in getting it cleaned up, furnished and ready for occupancy.

I look forward to filling this space in the next Network with details about our family and the experience of getting them settled. Building a Beloved Community Work:

- o The first *Sacred Ground* Circle is off to a great start! We've completed 4 sessions of 10. There are sixteen of us who are learning and discussing our own experiences and understanding of slavery, racial injustice, and dehumanizing practices in our culture with two facilitators and excellent resources.
- The Building a Beloved Community team is looking for persons interested in working together to discover and <u>document the historical involvement of St. James' parish and</u> the Glastonbury community in racism.
- At the 2020 Diocesan Convention, **Resolution 7**, "Acknowledging and Confronting Systemic Racism, White Supremacy, and Anti-Black Bias" was passed. Part of Resolution 7 directs that "each Parish...take steps to discover and document historic complicity in racism in their parish and communities..." If you are interested in committing to this holy work, the Glastonbury Historical Society, the Connecticut historical society, and the archivist for ECCT has already made good strides in this research.
